

### WEST WRETHAM

It should be noted that there are in fact two churches in Wretham. At West Wretham, the church dedicated to St Lawrence was abandoned in 1794. It had a square 13<sup>th</sup> century tower, of which the upper half was rebuilt octagonally with an embattled parapet in the 15<sup>th</sup> century. The nave, chancel and south porch were mainly 14<sup>th</sup> century and much of the tower and walls survive.

It was in the decorated style of architecture and consisted of a 14<sup>th</sup> century chancel, nave, south doorway, 13<sup>th</sup> century tower with a 15<sup>th</sup> century embattled octagonal belfry. In 1553, there were two bells, one broken, which stood in the chancel, and two bell clappers. There is a sundial on the south wall of the tower.
